Tigers, Warriors win a tourney eagerly anticipated

Teams from Stewartville and Caledonia captured top honors at Pacesetter's annual Minnesota Youth Volleyball State Championships on Saturday, Oct. 28, at Paynesville High School.

The Stewartville Maroon squad, playing "up" one grade, was the eighth-grade champion, edging Annandale 25-22, 18-25, 15-13 in the title match.

Caledonia nabbed the seventh-grade crown, capped by a conquest of Minnewaska Area 25-15, 22-25, 15-6.

Sixteen eighth-grade teams and 12 seventh-grade teams assembled for the opportunity to play against rivals they haven't seen before in a quasi state tournament upon completion of their regular seasons.

8th grade: Stewartville Maroon champion, Annandale runner-up

Stewartville Maroon got past Park Rapids, Rocori, and Dilworth-Glyndon-Felton to reach the finals against Annandale.

"We are a team of all seventh-graders this year," said coach Amy Theobald, who was assisted by Michelle Krause. "We were looking to improve on our third place finish last year in the seventh grade division as sixth graders. The girls like to push themselves and play better competition."

gan Arndt (middle hitter), Kaitlyn Carolan (outside hitter), Sylvia Heusinkvelt (outside hitter), Quinn Krause (right side hitter), Ellasyn Spencer (libero), and Camryn Klar (defensive specialist).

Heusinkvedt and Carolan led in kills. Romens, Arndt and Krause led in blocks. Theobald and Ferrie provided the assists. Klar and Spencer led in digs.

Stewartville entered two squads. Their Gold team also did well, placing third, losing only to Annandale.

The Annandale lineup included Avin Schuler (libero), Grace Whelan (outside hitter), Hailey Jenniges (middle hitter), Natalie Wilcox (setter), Jacie Lee (setter), Grace Grube (middle hitter) and Clara Uecker (outside hitter).

The Cardinals defeated Bagley, Grand Rapids and Stewartville Gold to reach the finals. In a 6-2 rotation, Uecker and Lee led in kills. Schuler took most of the passes. Lee and Wilcox split the setting duties.

"The girls really look forward to this tournament," coach Jodi Lee said. "We played it last year with the almost exact same result as this year. It definitely

draws teams from all over state."

Annandale fielded four different teams at the eighthgrade level in the regular season, Lee said, so this group had not played together before.

7th grade: Caledonia champion, Minnewaska Area runner-up

Caledonia had a first-round bye, then repelled West Central Area and New Ulm to earn the finals berth against Minnewaska Area.

The Warriors roster included Elin Blum, Lilly Augedahl, Ava Bernau, Lydia VanRavenhorse, Jaelyn Foellmi, Chloe Kruse, Kennedy Fruechte, Braylee Konz, Layton Hoshiet, Ali Steele, Nyah Rommes and Ashlyn Reinhart.

"It was a solid 12-girl effort, fun to watch and participate in," coach Dan Reinhart said. "Thanks to Paceset-





ter for the invite and a good day of volleyball." Rommes powered the team offensively, leading in aces and kills, the coach said. Augedahl and Reinhart sparkled in serve receive and "putting up a solid defensive effort, both front and back row." Steele put up some "excellent hittable balls consistently."

Minnewaska Area proceeded to the finals with a bye and close wins over Hawley and Belgrade-Brooten-Elrosa. The Lakers got it done with just seven players: Ava Moen (setter), Ally Johnsrud (outside hitter), Taylor Schultz (outside hitter), Cate Frey (libero), Sophie Boll (middle hitter), Piper Barsness (rightside hitter, setter) and Adeline Oeltjen (middle hitter).

Boll, Schultz and Johnsrud led in kills. The team showed good hustle and made it hard for opponents to find an open area, Johnsrud said. "Our back row passing was on target and we did a nice job of setting up our hitters. We have a strong serving team."



State field set; Wayzata, Marshall, SW Christian, RTR are top seeds

Wayzata, champion of the last three state tournaments, and the lone unbeaten (31-0) in the state in any class, is top-seeded in Class 4A, heading into the state volleyball tournament,

Action starts Wednesday and concludes Saturday at Xcel Energy Center. See schedule on the next page.

The Trojans attack is led by Olivia Swenson with 313 kills, Avery Jesewitz with 212 kills and 47 aces, Katie Kelzenberg with 186 kills, and Stella Swenson with 57 aces and 784 assists. The Swenson twins are both among five Ms. Baden Volleyball finalists

The No. 2 seed is New Prague (25-5), winners of 21 of their last 22. No. 3 is Rogers (28-3), led by Anya Schmidt with 430 kills and 111 aces.

The other entrants are Edina, Eagan, Anoka, Minnetonka and Stillwater. It's the 16th appearance for Eagan, which has six titles, most recently in 2016.

Marshall (27-5), which has captured the last two championships and eight in all, making its 32nd state appearance, is top-seeded in Class 3A.

Delano (28-2), making its eighth appearance with no titles yet, is No. 2 seed. Byron (23-4) is No. 3 in just its second state trip, the other in 2009.

The other entrants are DeLaSalle, Detroit Lakes, Grand Rapids, Mahtomedi, and Monticello. Grand Rapids has a Miss Baden Volleyball finalist, setter Braya LaPlant.

Southwest Christian (26-5) is the top seed in Class 2A. The Stars. making their fifth state appearance, have one championship, in 2013. One of their stalwarts is Luca Bredenburg, who recently passed 1,000 career digs.

Pequot Lakes (27-5) is No. 2 and Caledonia (27-5) is No. 3. The rest of the field is Wadena-Deer Creek, Rush City, Annandale, Redwood Valley, and Concordia Academy.

There's only four previous championships in this field, two by Concordia Academy and one each by Southwest Christian and Wadena-Deer Creek.

Russell-Tyler-Ruthton (27-6), making its first state appearance, garnered the top seed in Class 1A.

The No. 3 ranked Knights toppled No. 1 Minneota, the defending state champion, with three of the last four titles, in the Section 3A finals 15-25, 25-23, 25-15, 22-25, 17-15.

Mayer Lutheran (26-6), a four-time champion, most recently in 2021, is the No. 2 seed. Mable Canton (35-1) is No. 3. The rest of the field is Pine River-Backus, New Life Academy, West Central Area, Ely and Badger-Greenbush-Middle River.
