What is Pacesetter?

Pacesetter Sports is an organization that was created in 1980 to teach championship basketball to players in their own gyms through summer camps. The Pacesetter camp directors were players that had won state championships who love teaching kids. Pacesetter added tournaments in 1993. In 45 years Pacesetter has provided over 2,000 camps and 2,000 tournaments.

What is the Pacesetter Great Five-State Championship?

In 2010, Pacesetter introduced the Great Four-State Championship system for youth basketball teams in Minnesota, South Dakota, North Dakota, and Iowa. The top two teams in each state tournament for each grade/gender group were invited to advance to the "Great State" championships at the Target Center in Minneapolis. Teams have played for the over-all four-state title in an 8-team bracket from 2010-2017. In 2018, Wisconsin joined to make it the Pacesetter Great Five-State Championship. The Great State games are held in conjunction with MN Lynx games and are also supported by the MN Timberwolves.

Who can play? "Hometown Team" Focus

The Pacesetter playoff system is geared toward developing "hometown teams" that will be playing together in high school. All players on each team must either live in or attend school in the same city, or cities that are part of the same school district.

Why is a MN Lynx game ticket purchase required?

It is only possible to play on the Target Center court with a Lynx ticket purchase. Every player, coach and spectator must purchase a ticket. This purchase allows entry into the Target Center for the Lynx game and provides a FREE ADMISSION wristband for all Pacesetter games. There is no option to purchase an admission wristband without the Lynx game ticket. Great Five-State Weekend Lynx games: Saturday, June 14 Lynx vs. Los Angeles Sparks, 12:00 pm and Sunday, June 29 Lynx vs. Connecticut Sun, 6:00 pm.
