## 'Sweet 16' field set for Aug. 2-3

Lineups for the 35th annual Pacesetter Sweet 16 Championships, slated for Aug. 2-3 at College of St. Benedict's, have been set.

The state's most high-profile and longest-running summer tournament will be, as always, an old-fashioned one-class battle with entrants from all four MSHSL divisions, many likely to be state contenders next season.

The Sweet 16 boys field includes Hopkins and Alexandria from Class 4A. Alexandria, last year's Sweet 16 champion, was Class 3A state champion in March and will move up to Class 4A next year.

The Class 3A teams are Totino-Grace, Mankato East, St. Cloud Apollo, Orono and Mahtomedi.

The Class 2A teams are Breck, Montevideo, Cannon Falls, Waseca and Pequot Lakes. The Class 1A teams are Red Lake County, Pelican Rapids, Rushford-Peterson and Ada-Borup West.

The Sweet 16 girls field includes five Class 4A teams — Minnetonka, Roseville Area, Lakeville North, Rosemount and Forest Lake. Hopkins, which has won the most Sweet 16 titles, was not able to enter this year.

Other entrants are Orono from Class 3A, Breckenridge and New Richland-Hartland-Ellendale-Geneva from Class 2A, and Sleepy Eye St. Mary's, Mayer Lutheran, and MACCRAY from Class 1A. Three openings remain. Call Tracey at Pacesetter if interested - 320-243-7460.
