All MIT teams will play 3-4 full games on Saturday, March 28. Teams will be accepted on a first-come, first served basis with a limit set at 16 teams per grade.

Frequently Asked Questions • Notes by Jeff McCarron, Director

What is the Pacesetter Minnesota Youth Basketball State Tournament?

Region champion and runner-up teams will be invited and should register for this 8-10 team bracket with the top two teams advancing to the Great Five-State Championship at the Target Center in Minneapolis. The State tournaments for grades 8-9 will be open tournaments with all eligible school/community teams invited to play. Teams should register soon. The field will be open to all teams that register by March 18. The State tournament will be held at multiple locations in St. Cloud on Sunday, March 29.

What is the Pacesetter MIT?

All teams in grades 4-7 that participate in a Region Playoff, except the champions, will be invited to play in the Pacesetter MIT (Minnesota Invitational Tournament) on Saturday, March 28, in St. Cloud. Teams in each MIT bracket will play 3-4 games in a 4-16 team tournament format. Teams will be accepted on a first-come, first served basis. Teams are asked to register by March 18 as the field will be limited to the first 16 teams to register. Great State Invitations may be awarded to some top teams.

How do teams register?

To enter, register on the Pacesetter website, use this QR code or contact the office and have the link emailed to you.



Is there a fee to play in State or the MIT?

Yes, all tournaments have expenses, including rent, officiating, staffing, awards, etc., so both the State and MIT tournaments will require a \$240 team fee.

Do we have to fill out a roster and waivers again if we play?

No, the online roster and waivers you submitted for the Region will be honored. However, teams do need to bring a paper roster to each tournament.

Can I add players or update my roster?

Yes, to make changes or add eligible players to your roster, email pacesettersportsmbbn@gmail.com. Please provide your team name, grade, gender, players' names, and the school they attend. Be sure to bring your updated paper roster to the tournament.

Are teams separated by class?

Teams are not separated by class.

Are teams seeded?

Teams will be seeded into State and MIT based on their team rating and performance at the region tournament in an attempt to balance the bracket and divide the strongest teams. As the tournament progresses, all teams will be playing teams that have fared the same, whether winning or losing, so the competition becomes more balanced as the day progresses.
