Curtain call for Greenway: Miss Basketball award

Maddyn Greenway, who had already won everything else you can win, capped her Minnesota high school career with the Miss Basketball Award.

Greenway was announced as the coaches association's award recipient at their all-star weekend banquet on Friday, April 10.

The Providence Academy guard was not playing in the all-star games the next day because she was booked for national games. Her next team will be Kentucky.

The blazing, 5-foot-8, three-sport state champion finished as Minnesota's all-time leader in points (5,621), assists (1,304) and team championships (five). She played in a record 18 state tournament games (and six finals) and amassed a record 555 points, an average of 30.8 per game.

Greenway was the Star-Tribune's state Player of the Year for both her junior and senior seasons. She averaged 36.5 points this year, second in the state behind Crosby-Ironton's Tori Oeh-

rein (37.8). She led the state with 304 assists and was fourth with 196 steals, leading Providence Academy to its record fifth title in a row.

Greenway played for Team USA in the Nike Hoop Summit on April 11, notching 11 points and four steals

to help defeat a World Team 104-77. She also played in the McDonald's All-American Game on March 31, and Jordan Brand Classic on April 17.

The other Miss Basketball finalists, and their college teams, are as follows: Kate Amelotte, Wayzata (Creighton); Kate Holmquist, Maple Grove, (Montana); Mya Moore, Orono, (Creighton); Tori Oehrlein, Crosby-Ironton, (Minnesota); and Audrey Shindelar, Stewartville (South Dakota State).

Greenway is also the state career scoring leader in soccer with 214 goals, led the Lions to Class 1A state championships the last two seasons -- and got the Miss Soccer award, too, for Class 1A. State championships follow her around. In track-and-field last spring she was gold medalist in the 300 hurdles and anchored a state champion 4 by 400 relay.

Pacesetter Tour of Champions camps feature all-star lineup

An impressive array of high school and college coaches will be molding the skills of players attending Pacesetter basketball camps this summer.

“We have a heckuva lineup which took a lot of time to assemble,” said Jeff McCarron, Pacesetter camps director. “A large number of Minnesota’s best coaches are stepping up to offer their best tips to players AND coaches.”

McCarron calls the camp series the Pacesetter Tour of Champions. The camps are also available to coaches to attend as free clinics. A list of camps and who’ll be coaching there appears on page 13.

McCarron is pleased to have **Greg Troland** assisting him at several sites. Troland was an all-tournament player for Moorhead on two state runner-up teams, losing to Edina in 1967 and 1968, and was a teammate of McCarron’s on the Gophers’ Big Ten champion team in 1972.

This will be the 41st year that **Paul McDonald** has graced the Pacesetter camps. McDonald is a two-time state champion as a player at Chisholm (’73 and ’75), who coached Vermilion to a 539-248 record and four juco national tournaments. “I still get excited,” he said, “walking into the gym and sharing knowledge about the great game of basketball. Giving back to the game is still my passion.”

“It’s always a great day,” said **Wendy Kohler**, coach of 15 state teams and one state title at Alexandria, and three-time state coach of the year, “when I can be in the gym teaching and stacking skills to help athletes be a more efficient basketball player — but also to reinforce so many other things that will help them be successful in the game of life. Standards, work ethic, preparation, leadership, vision, energy, joy and confidence are just a few intangibles that have served our program in Alexandria.”

Tom Vix, who had a 684-239 record at Rushford-Peter-

son with 16 state tournament appearances, three state champions and two runners-up, said, “I’m looking forward to motivating young athletes to continue their efforts to become the best basketball player and person they can be. I want hard work to be fun.” The two-time state coach of the year added, “The young athletes will gain knowledge, work on skill development and take-home drills that they can use for the rest of their careers. I think stories of what it takes to be successful will be life lessons to benefit all athletes.”

Dave Cresap was national Coach of the Year in 2011, had five state teams and one championship at Perham, and coached M State of Fergus Falls to a 30-4 record

and national fourth-place junior college finish in 2024-25. Cresap looks forward to “helping players grow their skills and confidence in a fun, competitive environment while sharing my passion for the game.” He added, “Campers will benefit from great instruction, positive energy, and fundamentals that will help them succeed on the court.”

Seth Anderson, former MIAC MVP and D-III All-American at Gustavus Adolphus, has a 252-96 record at Waseca with six state trips and one championship in 2025. “I’m excited to bring some of the drills and skills that I think are important to new people,” he said, “and give them a chance to grow in the game of basketball.”

The Pacesetter lineup also includes:

—**Jeff Buffetta**, coach of 14 state teams with one state title and three runner-up finishes, with Mountain Iron-Buhl girls.

—**Tim Anderson**, three state tournament teams and a 408-158 record with Maple River, and an assistant on two state champion teams.

—**Joel McDonald**, 1991 Mr. Basketball and leader of a Chisholm state champion team 1991, starred at St. Cloud State and coached Hibbing for 23 seasons, specializes in Skills Specific training.

—**Sascha Hansen**, played for two state champion teams at Marshall, was a three-year St. Cloud State captain, all conference player, Female Athlete of the Year, and coached Southwest MN State and St. Cloud Tech.

—**Katie Borowicz**, Roseau state champ team member, 2,000-pointer and state record holder with a 21-assist game, was a Gopher starter at age 17, and was Hamline assistant coach

—**Jeff Wall**, coach of two state runner-up boys teams at Maranatha Christian and later Anoka coach with a 640-302 composition record

—**Gary Thomas**, coach of a South Dakota state boys champion at Watertown with five state trips in six years,

and later Augustana College head coach for 5 seasons

— **David Iverson** took Deer River boys to its first state tournament, now coaching St. Paul Harding girls, was NAIG silver medalist coach in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

— **Ryan Zyla**, women’s coach at MN North juco in Ely, after high school stints in Texas and Michigan.

— **Ayden McDonald**, over 2400 points, 1000 assists and 500 steals for Hibbing, currently with UM-Duluth coaching staff.

— **Jeff McCarron**, Pacesetter founder/owner since 1980, member of state champion team at Sherburn (1970) and Big Ten champs with Gophers (1972), director of over 300 camps, founder of IBA (1995) which became NBA D League.

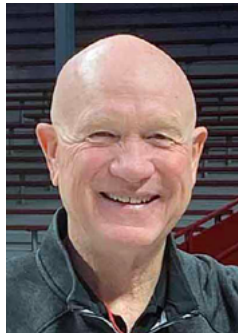

Cracks, Crevices, Pockets – and Rudy’s Free Throw!

The greatest players -- who are also the most fun to watch -- are the ones “reading the court” and delivering the double doubles or triple doubles. They see the movement of the defensive players and their own teammates in ways others don’t.

Those that make it happen in the flow of a fastbreak or transition are the most exciting and effective artists. I think of Caitlin Clark and Paige Bueckers for the women. Tyus Jones for the men. These three are picked for a reason.



Caitlin is thinking scoring first, but she’s quick to see a pocket where she can dish the ball to a teammate. No one is more accurate on the timing of passes than she is.

Paige looks to either shoot or pass at all times – I call it “seeing the cracks and crevices”, where she can exploit the defense. She is reading constantly with or without the ball. The decision to pass or shoot is neutral and awaits the right “crack or crevice” to reveal itself. She knows multiple ways to shoot it for every situation, and you may see 10 different shots for her 10 made shots. Tyus looks to pass first. He’s a facilitator – much like Isaac Asuma with the Gophers – who only tries to score when it rises up and tells him - “Shoot it!” And both can score when they need to, but they don’t look for it 50-50 like Paige. Both would be better players if they did.

So let’s talk about the cracks and crevices. They happen when the defense is on the move – chasing a fastbreak or trying to get settled in transition. This is too often the time when Anthony Edwards waits for them to get settled! Once the cracks and

crevices have healed and sealed, he is ready to try to break them down and get a shot or drive to the basket. He’s good – he’s great – but he is passing up way too many cracks and crevices in transition where he could take it to the hoop. Too many dribbles often ends up in a turnover, and we saw all too often against OKC last spring. Dribble it, and we’re gonna strip it from you.

Ant is starting to see that, and so are the young guns that ran Denver out of the gym the other night in Minneapolis. They doubled and tripled Murray and Jokic when they started their one-on-one routines and turned it into fastbreaks at the other end. Guys like Murray can be almost impossible to stop off the dribble, but with pressure and double-teaming, he can only handle so much. When Randle put it on the floor too much vs. OKC, the ball was gone.

Players thinking too much about the shot, can lose to the double team. Players thinking too much about the pass and not the shot are missing good opportunities to score – so it comes down to players like Paige who are almost always in 50-50 mode who can constantly exploit the other team. Jokic has 50-50 gear and tears teams apart, but he swings back and forth, depending on the quarter and is vulnerable to being double teamed when he’s in the “pounding it inside” mode.

It’s something to think about and watch. Cracks and crevices happen off screens, cuts, and cross-court passes – but never quite as plentiful as off transition.

The team that is more aggressive is almost always the winner. Aggressive defensively as the Timberwolves can be. Strip and muscle and overwhelm the offensive players into turning it over – and then push it up court. Teams in “Attack Mode” are very difficult to beat.

On offense, push it in transition. Attack or pass to the lane first, then out to the shooter. Be aggressive taking the ball to the paint. Players have to respond when the ball goes inside, which opens up everything else. For the four players without the ball – move, screen, back cut, find a shooting pocket.

If you've ever played Tic-Tac-Toe, there's one secret – get your X into the middle, and your opponent will be “on their heels” the rest of the game. Get the ball into the lane – don't stall around in there – and either take it to the basket or get it to a player finding a crack or crevice to the basket or a shooting “pocket” on the perimeter.

RUDY'S FREE THROW ISSUE – A Simple Answer

The simple issue is that Rudy is shooting from his low pocket - “the pocket below his eyes”. This is the pocket he'd use if he was shooting from half court – not the free throw line – where his arms coil when he brings it under his chin. Using that coiled-arm form from that close would be nearly impossible for every strong adult male. For really big, strong and long guys, especially, like Wilt and Shaq – they never found out why they couldn't shoot free throws. Their arms and wrists were way too powerful from a short distance. Take them out of the shot!

Here's what I learned after teaching shooting for years.... Short shots are very difficult and nearly impossible with too much arm coil or motion. We had a 3-foot no-bank shot in our camp program called “Touch Shots”. It was from the side of the basket. My idea, yet it was a horrible shot for me. TOO CLOSE! And no backboard. I had tight wrists and strong arms. I finally figured it out:

Shoot it with your arm completely extended – all that power in the coil is then already extended – so that the ball is in your fingertips as high as you can reach it. Bring it down only as much as you need to fully flip your wrist and fingertips to get the ball to the basket. FLIP! You fully flip your wrist and fingertips from 3 feet and it's a soft simple shot. Step back a foot. Bring it down an-

other inch – FLIP! Another foot – down another inch – FLIP! The feeling of fully flipping your wrist, yet feeling the touch off your fingertips is wonderful!

Some guys have loose wrists – like Oscar Robertson – where his wrist bent way back in his shooting form, so maybe he never had the tight wrist issue. But Shaq had it and Wilt – along with very powerful arms. Due to my tight wrists, I had to learn to stretch my arms way out to be able to shoot with touch. That technique actually made shooting simpler.

If Rudy shot with the ball as high as he could reach – which is really high – and only brought the ball down far enough to have enough power to flip it into the net with only his fingertips – while flopping his wrist fully as well – I believe he could stand there and make 10 in a row within 30 minutes. Imagine what that would do to his confidence. His high pocket would be almost 9 feet in the air – not tucked under his chin at 6 feet. It would be a very short distance the ball would be traveling, especially if he leans forward a foot. Ball on fingertips, reaching as high as he can – then dropping his fingers down only a few inches into his “high pocket” – then FLOP. Feel the ball spin off the fingertips.

He should only drop his fingers down enough so that it requires a full flop of his wrists to get his fingertips to shoot it 14 feet (leaning forward 1 foot). The ball should not be touching his hand at all. When he shoots from his low pocket, he knows he has too much power in his coil and is actually trying to NOT SHOOT IT TOO FAR. Very difficult. With his arms extended high and the ball high on his fingertips, all the power would be out of his arm, and his wrist would be just cocked a bit.

Please, coaches, give it a try if you haven't yet. I would be happy to come in and work with him. 70% instead of 50% could change a game and a season. I know he can do it – from the VERY HIGH pocket...and what a wonderful feeling that would be for him and all of us!

Christian Wiggins, Wayzata guard, has received the Bob McDonald Award for the 2025-26 season — adding to his previous major honors: Mr. Basketball and Star-Tribune Player of the Year. The McDonald Award, given by the coaches association, was announced April 12, during the state all-star games.

The Iowa State recruit, averaged 21 points, eight rebounds and four assists for the Trojans. He totaled 1,799 career points, a team record. His team was ranked No. 1 all year and placed fifth in the state tournament after being upset by Apple Valley in the quarterfinals. Wiggins helped the Trojans win state as a junior.

Breakout year for homegrown 'U'

A Gopher women's team with four Minnesotans in the starting lineup enjoyed a breakout season under coach Dawn Pitzuweit. The Gophers earned their first NCAA appearance since 2018 and with a high enough seed to host two rounds and made the most of it with home victories before over 10,000 fans to reach their first Sweet 16 since 2005. When the Gophers fell in the third round to UCLA 80-56, they had the consolation of losing to the eventual national champions.

Tori McKinney (junior from Hopkins) averaged 12.7 points per game, Grace Grochalski (senior from Wisconsin) 12.1, Mara Braun (senior from Wayzata) 11.7, Amaya Battle (senior from Hopkins) 11.1, and Sophie Hart (senior from Farmington) 11.1.

The Gophers tied for fourth place of 18 teams in the Big Ten with a 13-6 record. They went 24-9 overall and 15-3 at Williams Arena. They broke into the Top 25 late and finished No. 15 by the AP and No. 18 in the coaches poll. One drawback was losing in the first round of the conference tournament to Ohio State 60-55.

The No. 4 seeded Gophers had two big fourth quarters in the Sacramento Regional at Williams Arena, beating No. 14 Wisconsin-Green Bay 75-58 after trailing 49-45 at the third stop, and beating No. 5 Mississippi 65-63 — on Battle's last-second step-back jump shot — after trailing 54-46 at the third stop.

"This has been a journey that has been in the making for quite a few years now," Pitzuweit commented after the two NCAA wins. "For this team, for a lot of the young ladies who are a part of this. They've been with us for a few years ... They've worked their tails off."
